## The Will: The Governing Power

- 2 "Christian perfection consists in the complete harmony of our
- 3 will with the will of our Creator. The inhabitants of Heaven find,
- 4 in obeying the will of God, their joy and blessedness." {ST May

- 6 What does the Lord require of his blood-bought heritage?—The

7 sanctification of the whole being,—purity like the purity of

- 8 Christ, perfect conformity to the will of God. {RH November 24,
- 9 1904 Par. 3}
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11 2. What is the will? Under whose control is the will?

"Pure religion has to do with the will. The will is the governing power in the nature of man. If the will is set right, all the rest of the man will come under its sway. The will is not the taste or the inclination, but it is the choice, the deciding power; the kingly power which works in the children of men unto obedience to God or to disobedience." {Lt49-1887.12}

19 It is the will. Where is your will? It is either on Satan's side or

20 Christ's side. Now it is up to you. Will you put your will today on

- 21 Christ's side of the question? That is the new heart. It is the new
- 22 will, a new mind. "A new heart will I give thee." Then let us
- 23 **begin right here.**" {1SAT 210.1}

3. What happened to the will at the time of the fall of man? Whatdo we need to do to overcome the effects of the fall?

"This will of man that is of so great consequence was at the fall 27 given into the control of Satan, and he has been working in man 28 to will and to do of his own good pleasure, but to the utter ruin 29 and misery of man. Now God made an infinite sacrifice in giving 30 Jesus, His beloved Son, to become a sacrifice for sin, that God may 31 now say, without violating one principle of His government, 32 "Yield yourself up to Me, give Me that will, take it from the 33 control of Satan, and I will take possession of it, I will work in 34 you to will and to do My good pleasure." Then He gives you the 35 mind of Christ, the will becomes transformed and the character 36 formed after Christ's character." {Lt49-1887} 37

"Through yielding to sin, man placed his will under the control 38 of Satan. He became a helpless captive in the tempter's power. 39 God sent His Son into our world to break the power of Satan, 40 and to emancipate the will of man. He sent Him to proclaim 41 liberty to the captives, to undo the heavy burdens, and to let the 42 oppressed go free. By pouring the whole treasury of heaven into 43 this world, by giving us in Christ all heaven, God has 44 purchased the will, the affections, the mind, the soul, of every 45 human being. When man places himself under the control of 46 God, the will becomes firm and strong to do right, the heart is 47 cleansed from selfishness, and filled with Christlike love. The 48 mind yields to the authority of the law of love, and every thought 49 is brought into captivity to the obedience of Christ." {OHC 50 104.351

52 "The living agent, by an act of faith of his own, places himself in the hands of the Lord for Him to work in him His good 53 pleasure in His time. ... This is a training process, a constant 54 55 discipline of the mind and heart, that Christ shall work His great work in human hearts. Self, the old natural self, dies, and Christ's 56 57 will is our will. His way is our way, and the human agent becomes, with heart, mind, and intellect, an instrument in the hands of God to 58 work no more wickedness, but the righteousness of Christ." {1888 59 60 666.2}

61 "Christ remembered our nature in the requirements he made. He 62 took our nature upon himself, and **brought to man moral power** 63 **to combine with human effort.** He would conform us to his 64 authority, that we may know his will. **He can and will, if we** 65 **submit to him, fill the chambers of the mind and the recesses of** 66 **the soul with his Spirit. Then our will is in perfect harmony** 67 **with the divine will. Our spirit may be so identified with his**  Spirit that in thought and aim we shall be one with him. Then
Satan will no longer control us. Christ is our Leader, and his
true followers like to keep in step with him. He speaks, and they
obey his voice. His people are made willing in the day of his
power." {YI August 17, 1899 Par. 3}
4. What happens when the will is not submitted to Christ?
"Satan will always rule the will that is not under the control of the

76 Spirit of God." {ST December 20, 1899 Par. 2}

"As in the days of Christ, the enemy of God works constantly to 77 lead men to place the will in his control, that God may be 78 79 forgotten. He knows that if this is done, he can control the whole man. He tempts men in many ways to forget their Creator. To some 80 he offers tobacco and alcoholic drinks. Others he tempts by 81 82 pointing them to their own degradation and helplessness. Those who yield to his temptations can have no conception of the love 83 84 of God. The will becomes enslaved, bound to pursue a course which the word of God does not justify." {ST November 19, 85 1896 Par. 7} 86

87 "The will of every human being should be under the discipline
88 and control of God; for, uncontrolled, it is a dangerous element.
89 Untold harm may be done if the enemy is allowed to take
90 control of the human will." {PUR February 16, 1905 Par. 1}

92 5. What happens when the will is surrendered to Christ?

"When we place our will in unison with the will of God, the
obedience that was exemplified in the life of Christ will be seen in
our lives." {ST December 20, 1899 Par.2}

96 "If the human agent consents, God can and will so identify His
97 will with all our thoughts and aims, so blend our hearts and
98 minds into conformity to His Word, that when obeying His will,
99 we are only carrying out the impulses of our minds." {OFC
100 268.5}

101 "As the will of man co-operates with the will of God, it becomes
102 omnipotent. Whatever is to be done at His command, may be
103 accomplished in His strength. All His biddings are enablings."
104 {COL 333.1}

105 "Under the supervision of divine power, the will is to become
106 strong, prompt, and firm." {PUR February 16, 1905 Par. 3}

107 "Self-control is a power that all may possess. It is gained by

108 placing the will wholly on the side of God, taking the will of

109 **God for your will.**" {OHC 219.3}

110 "Man is safe only when he places himself under the control of God. When this is done, the will becomes firm and strong to do 111 112 right; the heart is cleansed from all selfishness, and filled with a Christlike love and tenderness. The mind yields to the authority 113 114 of the law of love, and "every thought is brought into captivity to the obedience of Christ." The powers, hitherto "members of 115 unrighteousness," and "servants of sin," are consecrated to the 116 service of a God of love." {ST November 19, 1896 Par. 9} 117

118 "The way has been made clear for all those who choose to hear, 119 repent, and believe. All heaven is waiting the sinner's co-120 operation, and the only barrier that stands in his way is one 121 which he alone can remove,—his own will. He must submit to 122 the will of God, and through repentance and faith, come unto God 123 for salvation." {RH March 24, 1896 Par. 10}

"I saw that the angels of God are not to force or bend the will of 124 125 the individual they watch over. They are to gently chide, warn 126 and guard. Satan can never force back these holy angels from 127 their charge. None can do this but the individuals that they are 128 watching over. If these individuals continue to grieve these tender, 129 holy angels; if they go astray from their counsel and warnings, and 130 choose an independent course of their own, they will drive these angels from them. If the will is submitted to them, they will bend 131 it in the heavenly channel, and they will ever be on the watch 132 for their interests, leading them from a thousand dangers, 133 preventing their lives being taken by Satan, and, if they are 134 135 inclined to go a wrong course, stand in the path before them to prevent their ruin." {2SG 277.3} 136

"But if individuals continue to retain their own will, choose
their own course, and have their own way, the angels leave
them in sadness. Then Satan comes in to control the will, and
bend the mind, and smiles in hellish triumph at his success."
{2SG 278.1}

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143 6. What does it mean to exercise the will?

144 "The first step in the path of obedience is to surrender the will
145 to God. This may seem a difficult thing to do; for Satan will
146 present every possible objection, and will manufacture difficulties,
147 and magnify perplexities before the mind; but take the first step,
148 and the next step on the ladder of progress will be easier." {RH
149 October 9, 1894 Par. 6}

150 "In order for us to reach this high ideal, that which causes the
151 soul to stumble must be sacrificed. It is through the will that sin
152 retains its hold upon us. The surrender of the will is

153 represented as plucking out the eye or cutting off the hand. 154 Often it seems to us that to surrender the will to God is to 155 consent to go through life maimed or crippled. But it is better, 156 says Christ, for self to be maimed, wounded, crippled, if thus 157 you may enter into life. That which you look upon as disaster is 158 the door to highest benefit." {MB 61.1}

159 "The Spirit of God does not propose to do our part, either in the 160 willing or the doing. This is the work of the human agent in 161 cooperating with the divine agencies. As soon as we incline our 162 will to harmonize with God's will, the grace of Christ stands to 163 cooperate with the human agent; but it will not be the 164 substitute to do our work independent of our resolving and 165 decidedly acting." Lt 135, 1898

"You are often discouraged at finding yourself weak in moral 166 167 power, controlled by habits and customs of your old life in sin, to find yourself in slavery to doubt, and inefficient. You find 168 169 your emotional nature untrue to your best resolutions, untrue to 170 your most solemn pledges. Nothing seems real. Your own 171 inefficiencies lead you to doubt the sincerity of those who would do you good. The more you struggle in doubt, the more unreal 172 173 everything looks to you, until it seems that there is no solid ground for you anywhere. Your promises are nothing, they are like 174 175 ropes of sand, and you regard the words and works of those whom 176 you should trust in the same unreal light. You will be in constant 177 peril until you understand the true force of the will. You may 178 believe and promise all things, but I would not give a straw for 179 your promises or your faith until you put your will over on the 180 believing and doing side. If you will fight the fight of faith with your will power, in the work, I have not the least doubt that you 181 182 will conquer. Your feelings, your impressions, your emotions 183 are not at all to be trusted, for they are not reliable, especially 184 with your perverted ideas and the knowledge of your broken promises and forfeited pledges." {Lt49-1887} 185

186 "But I tell you that you need not despair. You must choose to 187 believe, although nothing seems true and real to you. ... Your 188 part is to put your will over on the side of Christ in the matter of faith. Just as you yield up your will to the will of Jesus 189 190 Christ, God immediately takes possession of that will, and 191 works in you to will and to do of His good pleasure; and all of 192 your nature is brought under the control of the spirit of Christ, 193 even your thoughts are subject to Him. You cannot control your 194 impulses, your emotions, as you may desire, but you can control 195 the will, and you can make an entire change in your life. Your

life, by yielding up your will to Christ, is hid with Christ in God
and allied to the power which is above all principalities and
powers. You have a strength from God that holds you fast to
His strength, and a new life, even the life of living faith, is
possible to you. But your will must co-operate with God's will...."
{Lt49-1887}

"Will you say, "I will give my will to Jesus, and I do it now"? 202 203 From that moment, be wholly on the Lord's side. **Disregard the** 204 pitiful clamoring of appetite, of custom, of passion. Give Satan 205 no chance to say, You are a wretched hypocrite. Close the door 206 so that Satan shall not thus accuse you and dishearten you. Say, "I will believe, I do believe that God is my helper," and you will 207 find that you will be triumphant in God. Every emotion will, by 208 209 steadfastly keeping the will on the Lord's side, be brought into 210 captivity to the will of Jesus...."

"Talk faith. "I will believe, I will believe that God can and will
give me, Henri Frey, the victory." Keep on God's side of the
line. Set not your foot once on the enemy's side, and the Lord
will be your helper, He will do for you that which it is not
possible for you to do for yourself." {Lt49-1887}

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217 7. What do we learn from Christ's example?

218 "Jesus Christ is our example in all things. He began life, passed 219 through its experiences, and ended its record, with a sanctified 220 human will. He was tempted in all points like as we are, and yet 221 because he kept his will surrendered and sanctified, he never 222 bent in the slightest degree toward the doing of evil, or toward 223 manifesting rebellion against God." {ST, October 29, 1894 par. 224 7}

226 8. What does this mean in our lives?

227 "Those who have a sanctified will, that is in unison with the will
228 of Christ, will day by day have their wills bound to the will of
229 Christ, which will act in blessing others, and react upon
230 themselves with divine power." {ST, October 29, 1894 par. 7}

231 "When the power of Satan over souls is broken, we see men 232 binding their will to the cross, and crucifying the flesh with the 233 affections and lusts. It is indeed a crucifixion of self; for the will is 234 surrendered to Christ. The will of man is none too strong when it 235 is sanctified and put on the side of Christ. The will is a power, 236 and as many triumphs are to be won in spiritual warfare, and 237 many points of progress to be made in the spiritual journey, and many lessons to be learned from Christ, the great Teacher,
it is necessary that the will should be sanctified. In
surrendering the will, the root of the matter is reached. When
the will is surrendered, the streams that flow from the fountain
will not be bitter, but will be as pure as crystal. {ST, October
29, 1894 par. 6}

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245 9. The will must be given to be possessed by God every day.

246 "My will must be given to God every day. I must have a growing 247 faith. I find it a constant warfare to fight the good fight of faith. 248 Unseen foes are constantly on my track, to weaken and discourage me. There must be a constant decision of my will to 249 250 believe that God means just what He says; and if I continue to 251 put my trust in Jesus, the source of all power, He has assured 252 me that He will keep that which I have committed to His trust, 253 against that day. I want to know that I am triumphant in God 254 every day, that every emotion, every thought, is brought into 255 captivity to the mind and will of God. I want the assurance that 256 He has taken possession of that will which I have placed in His 257 hands." {Lt42-1890.4}

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259 10. What must we constantly surrender?

260 "This is the secret of their power. Much prayer, and a
261 humbling of the heart, a constant surrender of the will to God,
262 will bring the help pledged to every worker by the Father, the
263 Son, and the Holy Spirit. Angels of God will work for those who
264 yield themselves to the leading of the Spirit." {7MR 354.1}

265 "Through the right exercise of the will, an entire change may be
266 made in your life. By yielding up your will to Christ, you ally
267 yourself with the power that is above all principalities and
268 powers. You will have strength from above to hold you
269 steadfast, and thus through constant surrender to God you will
270 be enabled to live the new life, even the life of faith." {SC 48.1}

271

11. Does this mean that we no longer have any will?

273 "God does not design that our will should be destroyed, for it is 274 only through its exercise that we can accomplish what He 275 would have us do. Our will is to be yielded to Him, that we may 276 receive it again, purified and refined, and so linked in 277 sympathy with the Divine that He can pour through us the tides 278 of His love and power. However bitter and painful this surrender 279 may appear to the willful, wayward heart, yet "it is profitable for 280 thee." {MB 62.2}

281 "The effort to "break the will" of a child is a terrible mistake. 282 ... Those who weaken or destroy individuality assume a responsibility that can result only in evil. While under authority, 283 284 the children may appear like well-drilled soldiers; but when the 285 control ceases, the character will be found to lack strength and steadfastness. Having never learned to govern himself, the youth 286 287 recognizes no restraint except the requirement of parents or teacher. This removed, he knows not how to use his liberty, and often gives 288 289 himself up to indulgence that proves his ruin. - {Ed 288.1}

Since the surrender of the will is so much more difficult for
some pupils than for others, the teacher should make obedience
to his requirements as easy as possible. The will should be
guided and molded, but not ignored or crushed. Save the strength
of the will; in the battle of life it will be needed." {Ed 288.2}

295 "Every child should understand the true force of the will. He 296 should be led to see how great is the responsibility involved in 297 this gift. The will is the governing power in the nature of man, the 298 power of decision, or choice. Every human being possessed of 299 reason has power to choose the right. In every experience of life, 300 God's word to us is, "Choose you this day whom ye will serve." 201 Joshua 24:15 Everyona may place his will on the side of the will

Joshua 24:15. Everyone may place his will on the side of the will
of God, may choose to obey Him, and by thus linking himself
with divine agencies, he may stand where nothing can force him
to do evil. In every youth, every child, lies the power, by the help
of God, to form a character of integrity and to live a life of
usefulness."{Ed 289.1}

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308 12. How do we maintain and enjoy the victory?

309 "Let us no longer gratify the enemy by complaining of the
310 strength of our evil will; for in so doing we are feeding and
311 encouraging our wills against God, and pleasing the evil one."
312 {ST October 29, 1894 Par. 8}

313 "Train and educate the mind to think and to talk of Jesus, and
314 Satan will lose his power over you. He cannot long bear to be in

315 the company of those who meditate and converse upon the love

of God. In this way the mind is strengthened." {ST September 4,

317 1893 Par. 5}

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
