- 18 for ourselves! What that means exactly is clouded with mystery—but

- 22 that the distorted understandings of partaking of the divine nature
- 23 bring potential danger of "holy flesh" thinking. Let us be clear:

- 213 personal Saviour and become partakers of His nature. As we
- 214 appropriate His words, we receive from them spiritual life and
- 215 strength. This is union with Christ." {Ms 146, 1903, par. 8}
- 216 "Partakers of the divine nature." Is this possible? Of ourselves we can
- 217 do no good thing. How, then, can we be partakers of the divine
- 218 nature?—By coming to Christ just as we are, needy, helpless,
- 219 **dependent**. He died to make it possible for us to be partakers of the
- 220 divine nature. He took humanity upon himself that he might reach
- 221 humanity. With the golden chain of his matchless love he has bound us
- 222 to the throne of God. We are to have power to overcome as he
- 223 overcame." {RH April 14, 1904, par. 2}
- 224 "The connection of the branch with the vine, Christ said to His
- disciples, represents the relation you are to sustain to Me. The scion is
- 226 grafted into the living vine, and fibre by fibre, vein by vein, it grows
- 227 into the vine-stock. The life of the vine becomes the life of the branch.
- 228 So the soul, dead in trespasses and sins, receives life through
- 229 connection with Christ. By faith in Him as a personal Saviour the
- union is formed. The sinner unites his weakness to Christ's
- strength, his emptiness to Christ's fulness, his frailty to Christ's
- 232 enduring might. Then he has the mind of Christ. The humanity of
- 233 Christ has touched our humanity, and our humanity has touched
- 234 Divinity. Thus, through the agency of the Holy Spirit, man
- becomes a partaker of the divine nature. He is accepted in the
- 236 Beloved." {ST September 7, 1904, par. 3}
- 237 "How abundant is the gift to our world of the Holy Spirit! It is beyond
- the power of language to express the blessings it brings to God's
- 239 people. If received and appreciated, the Holy Spirit will make us
- 240 holy, Christlike. Through its agency, we are united with Christ,
- 241 partakers of the divine nature. The reception of the Holy Spirit in its
- fulness is the great need of the church today. Let us pray earnestly that
- 243 it may soon be realized." {Lt178-1907.12}
- 244 "Christ in the heavenly courts laid aside His royal crown. He laid aside
- 245 His royal robe. He clothed His divinity with humanity, that
- 246 humanity by taking hold of Christ in obedience might be
- 247 partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is
- 248 in the world through lust." {Ms192-1907.7}
- 249 "To eat the flesh and drink the blood of Christ is to receive Him as a
- 250 personal Saviour, believing that He forgives our sins, and that we are
- 251 complete in Him. It is by beholding His love, by dwelling upon it,
- 252 by drinking it in, that we are to become partakers of His nature.
