Fasting in the Scriptures

Part 1

"Call a fast...."

"There are sins of this same character [oppression and lack of love] among us today, and they bring the rebuke of God upon his church. Wherever such sins are found, seasons of fasting and prayer are indeed necessary; but they must be accompanied with sincere repentance and decided reformation. Without such contrition of soul, these seasons only increase the guilt of the wrong-doer." Review and Herald, October 13, 1891, par. 6.

- 1 Exodus 19:10-11, 14 (Fasting when the Law was given on Mt. Sinai.)
- 2 Exodus 24:18; 34:28; Deut. 9:9, 18,25 (Moses' miracle sustaining on
- 3 the mount for forty days and forty nights.)
- 4 Leviticus 23:26-32 (On the Day of Atonement, people were required
- 5 to afflict their souls, which included fasting according to Mrs. White.)
- 6 Judges 20:26 (Israel fasted till evening after 18,000 men died at the
- 7 hands of the Benjamites, burning sacrifices, and inquiring whether
- 8 they should go out to battle them again.)
- 9 1 Samuel 7:6 (Israel fasted when acknowledging its sin.)
- 10 1 Samuel 31:13 (Seven-day fast after Saul and sons were buried.)
- 11 2 Samuel 1:12 (David's day-long fast for Saul and Jonathan after they
- 12 were killed.)
- 13 2 Samuel 12:16-22 (David's seven day fast for his sick child.)
- 14 1 Kings 19:4-10 (Elijah went forty days and nights in the strength of
- 15 God's miracle food.)

- 16 1 Kings 21:9, 12, 27 (Jezebel's false fast bringing Naboth's death.)
- 17 1 Kings 21: 25-29 (God's judgment on Ahab was delayed because he
- 18 humbled himself and fasted.)
- 19 1 Chronicles 10:12 (Seven day fast for Saul and sons 1 Sam. 31:13.)
- 20 2 Chronicles 20:3 (Jehoshaphat sought the Lord and proclaimed a fast
- 21 upon learning that a great multitude of Moabites were coming against
- 22 him and his people.)
- 23 Ezra 8:15, 21-23 (Ezra proclaimed a fast when he discovered that no
- 24 Levites had joined him, and in seeking God's special protection.)
- 25 Ezra 9:1-5 (Ezra tore his hair and fasted over the news that the people
- 26 had not separated themselves from the people of the land, and that the
- 27 leaders were foremost in that trespass.)
- 28 Nehemiah 1:4 (Nehemiah's first fast over troubling news from
- 29 Jerusalem.)
- 30 Nehemiah 9:1 (Assembly of children of Israel with fasting and sack-
- 31 cloth when they separated themselves from all foreigners and con-
- 32 fessed their sins.)
- 33 Esther 4:1-3,15-16 (Esther asked that all of the people join her fasting
- 34 for three days prior to her going unsummoned to the King.)
- 35 Esther 9:31 (Brief mention of fast proclaimed in Esther 4:15-16.)
- 36 Psalms 35:13 (David fasted in seeking health for others who were not
- 37 supportive of him.)
- 38 Psalms 69:10 (David fasted and put on sackcloth in seeking deliver-
- 39 ance from the reproach that was being placed upon him.)
- 40 Psalms 109:24 (David again fasted to overcome reproach.)
- 41 Isaiah 22:12 (The people had built up their own defenses, and were
- 42 choosing not to look to God or respect Him. God called for a fast, but
- 43 the people responded with feasting.)
- 44 Isaiah 58:3-6 (Ongoing oppression and lack of love caused God to ig-

- 45 nore the people's fast, and resulted in the Almighty's call for the true
- 46 fast.)
- 47 Jeremiah 14:12 (As a result of ongoing iniquity, God said he would
- 48 not hear the people's cries when they were fasting, and directed Jere-
- 49 miah to not pray for them.)
- 50 Jeremiah 36:4-10 (A fast was proclaimed for all the people in
- 51 Jerusalem and those who came there.)
- 52 Daniel 6:18 (Mention made of the king fasting while Daniel was in the
- 53 lions' den.)
- 54 Daniel 9:3-4: (Daniel's private fast was motivated by concern that
- 55 God's 70 years of judgment might be extended much longer.)
- 56 Daniel 10:1-3 (Daniel fasted three full weeks, seeking more informa-
- 57 tion. Jesus Himself responded.)
- 58 Joel 1:13-14 (A call to fast, hold a sacred assembly and cry out to
- 59 God.)
- 60 Joel 2:1, 13-17 (A call to fasting and sacred assembly in response to
- 61 the natural locusts disaster, sent in judgment from God.)
- 62 Jonah 3:5-10 (A pagan king's call to fasting, humbling, turning from
- 63 wickedness and crying out to God, to avert the judgment announced
- 64 by Jonah).
- 65 Zechariah 7:3-5 (God questions the kind of fasting going on by the
- 66 priests: "For Me?")
- 67 Zechariah8:18-19 (Calls for fasts of joy.)
- 68 Matthew 4:2 (Christ's forty day fast in the wilderness.)
- 69 Matthew 6:16-18 (The fasting of the pharisees is condemned.)
- 70 Matthew 9:14-15/Mark 2:18-19/Luke 5:33-35 (John's disciples ques-
- 71 tioned why the disciples of Jesus did not fast.)
- 72 Matthew 17:21/Mark 9:29 (Father and mute son fail to receive help;
- 73 fasting called for by Jesus.)

- 74 Mark 2:18 (See Matt. 9:14-15.)
- 75 Luke 2:36-38 (Anna served God with ongoing prayer and fasting.)
- 76 Luke 5:33-35 (See Matt. 19:14-15.)
- 77 John 1:47-48 (Nathanael prayed and fasted to understand truth EGW:
- 78 Ms8a-1888.)
- 79 Acts 1:14 (Fasting was part of the preparation for the outpouring of
- 80 the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost—ST January 20, 1898, par. 8.)
- 81 Acts 9:6,7 (Paul fasted for three days after his Damascus Road
- 82 conversion.)
- 83 Acts 10:30 (Cornelius fasted till 3 PM.)
- 84 Acts 12:5 ("The entire church engaged in fasting and prayer" while
- 85 Peter was in prison.)
- 86 Acts 13:2-3 (In the course of fasting, the Holy Spirit directed the
- 87 church to separate Barnabas and Saul for witnessing.)
- 88 Acts 14:23 (Prayer and fasting was part of the process of commission-
- 89 ing new elders in the church.)
- 90 2 Corinthians 6:5 (Going without food was a regular part of Paul's ex-
- 91 perience. Fasting also refers to abstaining from food for health and
- 92 other reasons.)
- 93 1 Corinthians 7:5 (Fasting is sometimes a priority.)
