The Will, The Kingly, Deciding Power, In The Nature of Man

- 1 What Does the Bible Say About the Will?
- 2 Philippians 2:13 "For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of
- 3 his good pleasure."
- 4 2 Cor. 3:5 "Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think any thing as of
- 5 ourselves; but our sufficiency is of God;"
- 6 Heb. 13:21 "Make you perfect in every good work to do his will, working in
- 7 you that which is well-pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ; to whom be
- 8 glory for ever and ever. Amen."
- 9 Ezekiel 36:25 "Then will I sprinkle clean water upon you, and ye shall be
- 10 clean: from all your filthiness, and from all your idols, will I cleanse you. 26 A
- 11 new heart also will I give you, and a new spirit will I put within you: and I will
- 12 take away the stony heart out of your flesh, and I will give you an heart of
- 13 flesh. 27 And I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my

- 19 What is the Will?
- 20 The will is not the taste or the inclination, but it is the choice, the deciding
- 21 power; the kingly power which works in the children of men unto
- 22 obedience to God or to disobedience. {Lt 49, 1887, par. 12}¹
- 23 What is the new heart? It is the new mind. What is the mind? It is the will.
- 24 Where is your will? It is either on Satan's side or Christ's side. Now it is [up
- 25 to] you. Will you put your will today on Christ's side of the question? That
- 26 is the new heart. It is the new will, a new mind. "A new heart will I give
- 27 thee." [Ezekiel 36:26.] Then let us begin right here. {Ms36-1891.43}

- 29 What is a Sanctified Will?
- 30 The will of man is none too strong when it is sanctified and put on the side
- 31 of Christ. The will is a power, ... it is necessary that the will should be
- 32 sanctified. {ST October 29, 1894 Par. 6} ... Those who have a sanctified
- 33 will, that is in unison with the will of Christ, will day by day have their
- 34 wills bound to the will of Christ, which will act in blessing others, and react
- 35 upon themselves with divine power. {ST October 29, 1894 Par. 7}

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37 What Do We Learn From Christ About A Sanctified Will?
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- 38 Jesus Christ is our example in all things. He began life, passed through its
- 39 experiences, and ended its record, with a sanctified human will. He was
- 40 tempted in all points like as we are, and yet because he kept his will
- 41 surrendered and sanctified, he never bent in the slightest degree toward
- 42 the doing of evil, or toward manifesting rebellion against God." {ST,
- 43 October 29, 1894 par. 7} ... The one absorbing aim of the life of Christ was
- 44 to do the will of his heavenly Father. He did not become offended with
- 45 God; for he lived not to please himself. {ST October 29, 1894 Par. 9}

- 47 Is There Such a Thing As an Unsanctified Will?
- 48 As in the days of Christ, the enemy of God works constantly to lead men to
- 49 place the will in his control, that God may be forgotten. He knows that if this
- 50 is done, he can control the whole man. He tempts men in many ways to
- 51 forget their Creator. To some he offers tobacco and alcoholic drinks. Others
- 52 he tempts by pointing them to their own degradation and helplessness.
- 53 Those who yield to his temptations can have no conception of the love of God.
- 54 The will becomes enslaved, bound to pursue a course which the word of
- 55 God does not justify. Reason is enfeebled; the power to distinguish between
- 56 right and wrong is lost; sacred and eternal realities are estimated as of less
- 57 value than gold, silver, houses, lands, and bank stock. The love of God fades
- 58 from the mind; and the captives in the tempter's power live on, "having no
- 59 hope, and without God in the world," because they do not behold the Lamb of
- 60 God. {ST, November 19, 1896 par. 7}
- 61 The will of man is aggressive, and is constantly striving to bend all things
- 62 to its purposes. If it is enlisted on the side of God and right, the fruits of
- 63 the Spirit will appear in the life; and God has appointed glory, honor, and
- 64 peace to every man that worketh good. { RH August 25, 1896, par. 1 } When
- 65 Satan is permitted to mold the will, he uses it to accomplish his ends. ... It is
- 66 Satan's work to dethrone God from the heart, and to mold human nature into
- 67 his own image of moral deformity. He stirs up the evil propensities,
- 68 awakening unholy passions and ambitions. He says, "All this power, these
- 69 honors, and riches, and sinful pleasures, will I give thee;" but his conditions are
- 70 that integrity shall be yielded, conscience blunted. Thus he degrades the human
- 71 faculties, and brings them into captivity to sin. { RH August 25, 1896, par. 3 }

- 73 Must Our Will Be Taken Back From Satan?
- 74 This will of man that is of so great consequence was at the fall given into
- 75 the control of Satan, and he has been working in man to will and to do of
- 76 his own good pleasure, but to the utter ruin and misery of man. Now God
- 77 made an infinite sacrifice in giving Jesus, His beloved Son, to become a
- 78 sacrifice for sin, that God may now say, without violating one principle of His
- 79 government, "Yield yourself up to Me, give Me that will, take it from the
- 80 control of Satan, and I will take possession of it, I will work in you to will
- 81 **and to do My good pleasure.**" {Lt49-1887.15}

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84 Many are inquiring, "How am I to make the surrender of myself to God?"
85 You desire to give yourself to Him, but you are weak in moral power, in
86 slavery to doubt, and controlled by the habits of your life of sin. Your
87 promises and resolutions are like ropes of sand. You cannot control your
88 thoughts, your impulses, your affections. The knowledge of your broken
89 promises and forfeited pledges weakens your confidence in your own sincerity,
90 and causes you to feel that God cannot accept you; but you need not despair.
91 What you need to understand is the true force of the will. This is the
92 governing power in the nature of man, the power of decision, or of choice.
93 Everything depends on the right action of the will. The power of choice God
94 has given to men; it is theirs to exercise. You cannot change your heart,
95 you cannot of yourself give to God its affections; but you can choose to
96 serve Him. You can give Him your will; He will then work in you to will
97 and to do according to His good pleasure. Thus your whole nature will be
98 brought under the control of the Spirit of Christ; your affections will be
99 centered upon Him, your thoughts will be in harmony with Him. {SC 47.1}
100 Desires for goodness and holiness are right as far as they go; but if you
101 stop here, they will avail nothing. Many will be lost while hoping and
102 desiring to be Christians. They do not come to the point of yielding the will to
103 God. They do not now choose to be Christians. {SC 47.2} Through the right
104 exercise of the will, an entire change may be made in your life. By yielding
105 up your will to Christ, you ally yourself with the power that is above all
106 principalities and powers. You will have strength from above to hold you
107 steadfast, and thus through constant surrender to God you will be enabled
108 to live the new life, even the life of faith. (SC 48.1)
109 There are some that come to our meetings; they will sit all through the
110 meetings; they have borne a few words of testimony now and then. They have
111 gone home and done just exactly, if not worse, than before. Why? Because
112 they had not the new heart. What is the new heart? It is the new mind.
113 What is the mind? It is the will. Where is your will? It is either on Satan's
114 side or Christ's side. Now it is [up to] you. Will you put your will today on
115 Christ's side of the question? That is the new heart. It is the new will, a
116 new mind. "A new heart will I give thee." [Ezekiel 36:26.] Then let us begin
117 right here. {Ms36-1891.43} Conversion is simple, very simple. Let us
118 commence right here to come into the kingdom of heaven. How? As a little
119 child. Just as simple as simple can be. You may get all your mysteries of the
120 new birth, and you cannot make anybody understand it, or understand it
121 yourself. But the best way for you is to give your mind to Jesus Christ, and
122 the mind is the will to put it on, and do just as Matthew did. {Ms36-
123 1891.44} The Lord Jesus came to Matthew. He was in a very unpopular
124 business, and all the Jews looked upon them to be despised, and Christ said to
125 Matthew, "Matthew, follow Me." [Matthew 9:9.] Did he say, "Oh Lord,
126 when I get good enough I will follow you"? Did he say, "Oh Lord, when I
127 have this agony, this awful agony [for] my sin, then I will come"? Well,
128 that is what many of you are saying. [No,] he rose up and followed Him.
129 He was walking in the light, because he could not follow Christ unless he was
130 walking in the light. Well then, what are we to do? We are just to believe as
131 simply as a little child. We are to take our position on the Lord's side, and
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- 132 we are to be Christ's children because He wants us to be, and because He
- 133 died that we might be, and will we be? {Ms36-1891.45}
- 134 One has asked, Are we never to have our own will, our own way? Yes, any
- 135 amount of will, our own way, but never apart from God's will and God's
- 136 way. We are the purchased possession of Christ. We are to give over our
- 137 entire being, our intellect, our ambition, our activities, all our capabilities,
- 138 into His service. "Ye are not your own. Ye are bought with a price: therefore
- 139 glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's." [1 Corinthians
- 140 6:19, 20.] If you give your everything to Jesus, He will give back to you
- 141 tenfold more than you have yielded. {Ms 61b, 1895, par. 48}
- 142 All heaven is waiting the sinner's co-operation, and the only barrier that
- 143 stands in his way is one which he alone can remove,—his own will. He
- 144 must submit to the will of God, and through repentance and faith, come unto
- 145 God for salvation. No one will be forced against his will; Christ draws, but
- 146 never compels, service from any man. ... Man is required to surrender self,
- 147 to submit to be a child of God, to submit to be saved by his grace, and
- 148 when this is done, divine agencies co-operate with the human agent, and
- 149 the character is transformed. It is in the surrender of the will that the line
- 150 of demarcation between a child of God, an heir of heaven, and the
- 151 rebellious, who refuse the great salvation, is distinctly drawn. { RH March
- 152 24, 1896, par. 10 }
- 153 Will you, my ministering brethren, grasp the rich promises of God? Will you
- 154 put self out of sight and let Jesus appear? Self must die before God can
- 155 work through you. I feel alarmed as I see self cropping out in one and
- 156 another here and there. I tell you, in the name of Jesus of Nazareth, your
- 157 wills must die; they must become as God's will. He wants to melt you over
- 158 and to cleanse you from every defilement. There is a great work to be done
- 159 for you before you can be filled with the power of God. I beseech you to
- 160 draw nigh to Him, that you may realize His rich blessing before this meeting
- 161 closes.533 { CCh 288.4}
- 162
- 163 Is It Easy To Surrender Our Will To God?
- 164 The Christian life is a battle and a march. But the victory to be gained is not
- 165 won by human power. The field of conflict is the domain of the heart. The
- 166 battle which we have to fight—the greatest battle that was ever fought by
- 167 man—is the surrender of self to the will of God, the yielding of the heart to
- 168 the sovereignty of love. The old nature, born of blood and of the will of the
- 169 flesh, cannot inherit the kingdom of God. The hereditary tendencies, the former
- 170 habits, must be given up.— {MB 141.2} ... The victory is not won without much
- 171 earnest prayer, without the humbling of self at every step. Our will is not to be
- 172 forced into co-operation with divine agencies, but it must be voluntarily
- 173 submitted. Were it possible to force upon you with a hundredfold greater
- 174 intensity the influence of the Spirit of God, it would not make you a
- 175 Christian, a fit subject for heaven. The stronghold of Satan would not be
- 176 broken. The will must be placed on the side of God's will. You are not able,
- 177 of yourself, to bring your purposes and desires and inclinations into submission
- 178 to the will of God; but if you are "willing to be made willing," God will
- 179 accomplish the work for you, even "casting down imaginations, and every

- 180 high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing
- 181 into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ." 2 Corinthians 10:5.
- 182 Then you will "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling. {MB
- 183 142.1}

- 185 What Level of Conformity To The Will Of God Is Required For
- 186 Transformation?
- 187 We cannot retain self and yet enter the kingdom of God. If we ever attain unto
- 188 holiness, it will be through the renunciation of self and the reception of the
- 189 mind of Christ. Pride and self-sufficiency must be crucified. Are we willing to
- 190 pay the price required of us? Are we willing to have our will brought into
- 191 perfect conformity to the will of God? Until we are willing, the
- 192 transforming grace of God cannot be manifest upon us. {MB 143.2}
- 193 Christ cannot share a divided heart; sin and Jesus are never in co-
- 194 **partnership**. 7LtMs, Lt 19b, 1892, par. 26
- 195 Firmness and sanctified decisions are what you need to turn square about, to
- 196 repent of your sins, to be converted and make it the law of your life to be true
- 197 to yourself and true to your God. Then, while you work out your salvation with
- 198 fear and trembling, it is God that worketh in you to will and to do of His own
- 199 good pleasure. No halfway purpose will do. For you it must be a thorough
- 200 decision. A conscientious surrender of your entire life to God is essential
- 201 **for you.** {Lt 36, 1887, par. 9}
- 202 Truth must be received into the soul; it claims the homage of the will. If
- 203 truth could be submitted to the reason alone, pride would be no hindrance in
- 204 the way of its reception. But it is to be received through the work of grace in
- 205 the heart; and its reception depends upon the renunciation of every sin
- 206 that the Spirit of God reveals. Man's advantages for obtaining a knowledge of
- 207 the truth, however great these may be, will prove of no benefit to him unless
- 208 the heart is open to receive the truth, and there is a conscientious
- 209 surrender of every habit and practice that is opposed to its principles. To
- 210 those who thus yield themselves to God, having an honest desire to know and
- 211 to do His will, the truth is revealed as the power of God for their salvation.
- 212 {DA 455.3}
- 213 The truth ... will be no real help to you personally unless the mind and heart
- 214 are open so that truth shall find entrance and you make a conscientious
- 215 surrender of every habit and practice, and every sin that has closed the
- 216 door against Jesus. Let the light from Christ search every dark corner of the
- 217 soul; with earnest determination adopt a right course of action. 7LtMs, Lt 19b,
- 218 1892, par. 24}

- 220 Does Our Will Become Blended With God's Will?
- 221 The will of every human being should be under the discipline and control
- 222 of God ... [The] will of man is safe only when united with the will of God.
- 223 When merged into the will of God it is a will joined to conscience, rightly
- 224 exercised in advancing the honour and glory of God. {BEcho, July 20,
- 225 1896 par. 5} God's word sets forth the will that is to be carried into the
- 226 recesses of the soul. If the human agent consents, God can and will so

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227 identify His will with all our thoughts and aims, so blend our hearts and
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- 228 minds into conformity to His word, that when obeying His will we are only
- 229 carrying out the impulses of our minds. {BEcho, July 20, 1896 par. 6}

- 231 What Does It Mean To Work Out Our Salvation With Fear and Trembling?
- 232 In harmony with this experience is the command, "Work out your own
- 233 salvation with fear and trembling. For it is God which worketh in you both to
- 234 will and to do of His good pleasure." Philippians 2:12, 13. God does not bid
- 235 you fear that He will fail to fulfill His promises, that His patience will weary,
- 236 or His compassion be found wanting. Fear lest your will shall not be held in
- 237 subjection to Christ's will, lest your hereditary and cultivated traits of
- 238 character shall control your life. "It is God which worketh in you both to will
- 239 and to do of His good pleasure." Fear lest self shall interpose between your
- 240 soul and the great Master Worker. Fear lest self-will shall mar the high
- 241 purpose that through you God desires to accomplish. Fear to trust to your
- 242 own strength, fear to withdraw your hand from the hand of Christ and
- 243 attempt to walk life's pathway without His abiding presence. {COL 161.1}
- 244 In this great day of atonement our work is that of heart-searching, of self-
- 245 abasement, and confession of sin, each humbling his own soul before God,
- 246 and seeking pardon for himself individually. Anciently every one that did
- 247 not on the day of atonement afflict his soul, was cut off from the people.
- 248 God would have us work out our own salvation with fear and trembling. If
- 249 each will search and see what sins are lurking in his own heart to shut out
- 250 Jesus, he will find such a work to do that he will be ready to esteem others
- 251 **better than himself**. He will no longer seek to pluck the mote out of his
- 252 brother's eye while a beam is in his own eye. {HS 213.3}
- 253 Grace and sufficiency have been abundantly provided for every soul. But
- 254 in order to receive this, man must unite with his divine Helper. Unless of
- 255 his own accord man consents to renounce his sinful practises, Christ can
- 256 **not take away his sin.** Man must heartily co-operate with God, **willingly**
- 257 obeying His laws, showing that he appreciates the great gift of grace.
- 258 Feeling his dependence upon God, having faith in Christ as his personal
- 259 Saviour, expecting efficiency and success only as he keeps the Lord ever
- 260 before him,—it is thus that man complies with the injunction, "Work out
- 261 your own salvation with fear and trembling." {ST September 25, 1901, par.

262 2}

- 264 Are There Limitations of the Will?
- 265 In the Saviour's parable, leaven is used to represent the kingdom of
- 266 heaven. It illustrates the quickening, assimilating power of the grace of
- 267 God. {COL 95.3} None are so vile, none have fallen so low, as to be beyond
- 268 the working of this power. In all who will submit themselves to the Holy
- 269 Spirit a new principle of life is to be implanted; the lost image of God is to
- 270 be restored in humanity. {COL 96.1} But man cannot transform himself
- 271 by the exercise of his will. He possesses no power by which this change can
- 272 be effected. The leaven—something wholly from without—must be put
- 273 into the meal before the desired change can be wrought in it. So the grace
- 274 of God must be received by the sinner before he can be fitted for the

kingdom of glory. All the culture and education which the world can give will fail of making a degraded child of sin a child of heaven. The renewing energy must come from God. The change can be made only by the Holy Spirit. All who would be saved, high or low, rich or poor, must submit to the working of this power. {COL 96.2} As the leaven, when mingled with the meal, works from within outward, so it is by the renewing of the heart that the grace of God works to transform the life. No mere external change is sufficient to bring us into harmony with God. There are many who try to reform by correcting this or that bad habit, and they hope in this way to become Christians, but they are beginning in the wrong place. Our first work is with the heart. {COL 97.1}

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287 What Results From Exercising the Will?

288 Pure religion has to do with the will. The will is the governing power in the 289 nature of man. If the will is set right, all the rest of the man will come 290 under its sway. The will is not the taste or the inclination, but it is the 291 choice, the deciding power; the kingly power which works in the children 292 of men unto obedience to God or to disobedience. Now you are a young man 293 of intelligence; you are seeking to make your life such as will give you heaven 294 at last. You are often discouraged at finding yourself weak in moral power, 295 controlled by habits and customs of your old life in sin, to find yourself in 296 slavery to doubt, and inefficient. You find your emotional nature untrue to 297 your best resolutions, untrue to your most solemn pledges. Nothing seems 298 real. Your own inefficiencies lead you to doubt the sincerity of those who 299 would do you good. The more you struggle in doubt, the more unreal 300 everything looks to you, until it seems that there is no solid ground for you 301 anywhere. Your promises are nothing, they are like ropes of sand, and you 302 regard the words and works of those whom you should trust in the same 303 unreal light. You will be in constant peril until you understand the true 304 force of the will. You may believe and promise all things, but I would not 305 give a straw for your promises or your faith until you put your will over on 306 the believing and doing side. If you will fight the fight of faith with your 307 will power, in the work, I have not the least doubt that you will conquer. 308 Your feelings, your impressions, your emotions are not at all to be trusted, 309 for they are not reliable, especially with your perverted ideas and the 310 knowledge of your broken promises and forfeited pledges. {Lt49-1887} 311 But I tell you that you need not despair. You must choose to believe, 312 although nothing seems true and real to you. I need not tell you it is yourself 313 that has brought you into this unenviable position; but you must win back 314 your confidence in God and in your brethren. Your part is to put your will 315 over on the side of Christ in the matter of faith. Just as you yield up your 316 will to the will of Jesus Christ, God immediately takes possession of that 317 will, and works in you to will and to do of His good pleasure; and all of 318 your nature is brought under the control of the spirit of Christ, even your 319 thoughts are subject to Him. You cannot control your impulses, your 320 emotions, as you may desire, but you can control the will, and you can 321 make an entire change in your life. Your life, by yielding up your will to 322 Christ, is hid with Christ in God and allied to the power which is above all

323 principalities and powers. You have a strength from God that holds you

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324 fast to His strength, and a new life, even the life of living faith, is possible
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- 325 to you. But your will must co-operate with God's will, not with the will of
- 326 associates through whom Satan is constantly working to ensnare and
- 327 **destroy you**. I do not give you up, Henri. I remember my own oldest son
- 328 Henry who died in the triumphs of faith a little past sixteen years old. I write to
- 329 you as I have often written to my own sons and adopted daughters. {Lt49-
- 330 1887}

- 331 Will you now without delay place yourself in right relations with God?
- 332 Will you say, "I will give my will to Jesus, and I do it now"? From that
- 333 moment, be wholly on the Lord's side. Disregard the pitiful clamoring of
- 334 appetite, of custom, of passion. Give Satan no chance to say, You are a
- 335 wretched hypocrite. Close the door so that Satan shall not thus accuse you
- 336 and dishearten you. Say, "I will believe, I do believe that God is my
- 337 helper," and you will find that you will be triumphant in God. Every
- 338 emotion will, by steadfastly keeping the will on the Lord's side, be brought
- 339 into captivity to the will of Jesus. You will then find your feet on solid
- 340 rock. It will take, you will find, at times, every particle of will power which
- 341 you possess, but it is God that is working for you, and you will come forth
- 342 from the molding process a vessel unto honor. Talk faith. "I will believe, I
- 343 will believe that God can and will give me, Henri Frey, the victory." Keep
- 344 on God's side of the line. Set not your foot once on the enemy's side, and
- 345 the Lord will be your helper, He will do for you that which it is not
- 346 possible for you to do for yourself. The result will be that you will become
- 347 a grand cedar of Lebanon. Your life will be noble, your works will be
- 348 wrought in God, there will be in you a directness, a power, an earnestness
- 349 and simplicity that will make you a polished instrument in the hands of
- 350 God. I am not speaking to you idle tales, but words of truth and verity.
- 351 **Try it and see.** {Lt49-1887} You need to drink daily at the fountain of truth,
- 352 that you may understand the secret of pleasure and joy in the Lord. But you
- 353 need to understand that your will is the spring of all your actions. This will
- 354 of man that is of so great consequence was at the fall given into the control
- 355 of Satan, and he has been working in man to will and to do of his own good
- 356 pleasure, but to the utter ruin and misery of man. Now God made an
- 357 infinite sacrifice in giving Jesus, His beloved Son, to become a sacrifice for sin,
- 358 that God may now say, without violating one principle of His government,
- 359 "Yield yourself up to Me, give Me that will, take it from the control of
- 360 Satan, and I will take possession of it, I will work in you to will and to do
- 361 My good pleasure." Then He gives you the mind of Christ, the will
- 362 becomes transformed and the character formed after Christ's character.
- 363 Does your will choose to do God's will? Does your will choose to obey the
- 364 Scriptures? "He that will come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his
- 365 cross and follow Me; so shall he be My disciple." {Lt49-1887}]
- 367 What Is The Outcome Of Exercising Our Will?
- 368 When the power of Satan over souls is broken, we see men binding their
- 369 will to the cross, and crucifying the flesh with the affections and lusts. It is
- 370 indeed a crucifixion of self; for the will is surrendered to Christ. The will of
- 371 man is none too strong when it is sanctified and put on the side of Christ. The
- 372 will is a power, and as many triumphs are to be won in spiritual warfare, and

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many points of progress to be made in the spiritual journey, and many lessons to be learned from Christ, the great Teacher, it is necessary that the will should be sanctified. In surrendering the will, the root of the matter is reached.
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When the will is surrendered, the streams that flow from the fountain will not be bitter, but will be as pure as crystal. {ST, October 29, 1894 par. 6}

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- 379 What About Exercising The Will In The Area Of Appetite?
- 380 The only safe course is to touch not, taste not, and handle not, tea, coffee,
- 381 wines, tobacco, opium, and alcoholic drinks. There is double necessity for the
- 382 men of this generation to call to their aid the power of the will,
- 383 strengthened by the grace of God, in order to withstand the temptations of
- 384 Satan, and resist the least indulgence of perverted appetite. The present
- 385 generation have less power of self-control than those who have lived several
- 386 generations back. Those who have indulged the appetite for these stimulants
- 387 have transmitted their depraved appetites and passions to their children, and
- 388 greater moral power is required to resist the indulgence of intemperance in all
- 389 its forms. The only perfectly safe course to pursue is to stand firmly on the
- 390 side of temperance and not venture in the path of danger. {HR August 1,
- 391 1875 Par. 9}
- 392 Let me say to him who is struggling to overcome, God presents before you a
- 393 strong hope, that you may lay hold on eternal life. Lose no opportunity of
- 394 becoming a man. When you look at yourself, and realize the strength of
- 395 temptation, you feel so weak in moral power that you say, "I cannot
- 396 resist." I tell you, you can resist, you must resist temptation. Although you
- 397 may have been overcome, although moral debasement may have marked your
- 398 course, it need not always be thus. Jesus is your helper. In his strength you
- 399 can overcome the beguiling power of appetite. Summon will-power to your
- 400~ aid. { CTBH $147.2~\}~$ The will is the governing power in the nature of man.
- 401 If the will is set right, all the rest of the being will come under its sway. The
- 402 will is not the taste or the inclination, but it is the choice, the deciding power,
- 403 the kingly power, which works in the children of men unto obedience to God or
- 404 to disobedience. { CTBH 147.3 } If you will fight the fight of faith with
- 405 your will-power, there is no doubt that you will conquer. { CTBH 148.1 }
- 406 Your part is to put your will on the side of Christ. When you yield your
- 407 will to his, he immediately takes possession of you, and works in you to will
- 408 and to do of his good pleasure. Your nature is brought under the control of his
- 409 Spirit. Even your thoughts are subject to him. If you cannot control your
- 410 impulses, your emotions, as you may desire, you can control the will, and
- 411 thus an entire change will be wrought in your life. { CTBH 148.2 }

- 413 How Often Should We Surrender Our Will to God?
- 414 My will must be given to God every day. I must have a growing faith. I find
- 415 it a constant warfare to fight the good fight of faith. Unseen foes are constantly
- 416 on my track, to weaken and discourage me. There must be a constant
- 417 decision of my will to believe that God means just what He says; and if I
- 418 continue to put my trust in Jesus, the source of all power, He has assured
- 419 me that He will keep that which I have committed to His trust, against that day.
- 420 I want to know that I am triumphant in God every day, that every emotion,

- 421 every thought, is brought into captivity to the mind and will of God. I want the
- 422 assurance that He has taken possession of that will which I have placed in
- 423 His hands. {Lt42-1890.4}

- 425 Should The Surrender Of The Will Be Ongoing!
- 426 This is the secret of their power. Much prayer, and a humbling of the
- 427 heart, a constant surrender of the will to God, will bring the help pledged
- 428 to every worker by the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Angels of God
- 429 will work for those who yield themselves to the leading of the Spirit. {7MR
- 430 354.1}
- 431 Through the right exercise of the will, an entire change may be made in
- 432 your life. {SC 48.1}
- 433 God does nothing without the co-operation of man. He compels no man's will.
- 434 That must be given to the Lord completely.... The potter cannot mold and
- 435 fashion unto honor that which has never been placed in his hands. The
- 436 Christian life is one of daily surrender, submission and continual
- 437 overcoming, gaining fresh victories every day {1888 667.

- 439 What If We Feel Nothing Has Changed?
- 440 You must choose to believe, although nothing seems true and real to you.
- 441 ... Your part is to put your will over on the side of Christ in the matter of faith.
- 442 Just as you yield up your will to the will of Jesus Christ, God immediately
- 443 takes possession of that will, and works in you to will and to do of His good
- 444 pleasure; and all of your nature is brought under the control of the spirit
- 445 of Christ, even your thoughts are subject to Him. You cannot control your
- 446 impulses, your emotions, as you may desire, but you can control the will,
- 447 and you can make an entire change in your life. Your life, by yielding up
- 448 your will to Christ, is hid with Christ in God and allied to the power which is
- 449 above all principalities and powers. You have a strength from God that
- 450 holds you fast to His strength, and a new life, even the life of living faith, is
- 451 possible to you. But your will must co-operate with God's will.... {Lt49
- 452 1887}

- 454 What If We Are Still Struggling?
- 455 Why is it so hard for many to walk uprightly before God? It is because
- 456 they are trying to serve two masters, a thing which the Saviour declares no
- 457 man can do. If they would give themselves to Jesus, he would take
- 458 possession of the soul, and every wrong desire, every false ambition, every
- 459 evil purpose, would be brought into subjection to the will of God. This is
- 460 the sanctification that Christ meant when he said, "I sanctify myself." This is
- 461 the sanctification that he desired for his disciples when he prayed, "Sanctify
- 462 them through thy truth." We profess to be sons and daughters of the Lord; the
- 463 chosen ones of Christ, of whom he says, "I have given them thy word; and the
- 464 world hath hated them, because they are not of the world, ever as I am not of
- 465 the world." What right have we to let the things of the world take possession of
- 466 the heart and engross our energies? What right have we to make the heart a
- 467 highway for the world's travel, or to imitate its customs and practices? We

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468 cannot serve God and mammon. We must come out from the world, and be
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- 469 separate. Its fashions are not to control us; its principles are not to be our
- 470 principles. {ST August 6, 1885 Par. 6}

- 472 Should We Complain That We Are Too Weak?
- 473 Let us no longer gratify the enemy by complaining of the strength of our
- 474 evil will; for in so doing we are feeding and encouraging our wills against
- 475 **God,** and pleasing the evil one. {ST October 29, 1894 Par. 8}

476

- 477 What Happens If Our Will Is Not Surrendered To God?
- 478 Satan will always rule the will that is not under the control of the Spirit of
- 479 **God**. {ST December 20, 1899 Par. 2}
- 480 The will of every human being should be under the discipline and control of
- 481 God; for, uncontrolled, it is a dangerous element. **Untold harm may be done**
- 482 if the enemy is allowed to take control of the human will. {PUR February
- 483 16, 1905 Par. 1}

484

- 485 What Happens When Our Will Is Surrendered to God?
- 486 When we place our will in unison with the will of God, the obedience that
- 487 was exemplified in the life of Christ will be seen in our lives. {ST December
- 488 20, 1899 Par.2}
- 489 If the human agent consents, God can and will so identify His will with all
- 490 our thoughts and aims, so blend our hearts and minds into conformity to
- 491 His Word, that when obeying His will, we are only carrying out the
- 492 impulses of our minds. {OFC 268.5}
- 493 As the will of man co-operates with the will of God, it becomes omnipotent.
- 494 Whatever is to be done at His command, may be accomplished in His strength.
- 495 All His biddings are enablings. {COL 333.1}

- 497 What Is Our Part Versus God's Part In Exercising The Will?
- 498 As soon as we incline our will to harmonize with God's will, the grace of
- 499 Christ stands to co-operate with the human agent; but it will not be the
- 500 substitute to do our work independent of our resolving and decidedly
- 501 acting. {Lt135-1898.9}
- 502 It is man's work to co-operate with the divine. And it is the very hardest,
- 503 sternest conflict which comes with the purpose and hour of great resolve and
- 504 decision of the human to incline the will and way to God's will and God's way,
- 505 relying upon the gracious influences which accompanied him all his life long.
- 506 The man must do the work of inclining, "For it is God which worketh in you
- 507 (us) both to will and to do." [Philippians 2:13.]" ... {Lt135-1898.13}
- 508 If man places his will on God's side, fully surrendering self to God's will,
- 509 the high and holy endeavor of the human agent takes down the obstruction
- 510 he himself has erected, the rubbish is cleared away from the door of the
- 511 heart, the defiance and barricading of the soul is broken down. The door
- 512 of the heart is opened and Jesus enters, to abide as a welcome guest.
- 513 {Lt135-1898.14}

- 515 Can The Will—The Governing, Kingly Power—Be Damaged?
- 516 The effort to "break the will" of a child is a terrible mistake. ... Those who
- 517 weaken or destroy individuality assume a responsibility that can result
- 518 **only in evil.** While under authority, the children may appear like well-drilled
- 519 soldiers; but when the control ceases, the character will be found to lack
- 520 strength and steadfastness. Having never learned to govern himself, the youth
- 521 recognizes no restraint except the requirement of parents or teacher. This
- 522 removed, he knows not how to use his liberty, and often gives himself up to
- 523 indulgence that proves his ruin. {Ed 288.1}
- 524 A child may be so trained as to have, like the beast, no will of his own.
- 525 Even his individuality may be merged in the one who superintends his training;
- 526 his will, to all intents and purposes, is subject to the will of the teacher.
- 527 Children who are thus educated will ever be deficient in moral energy and
- 528 individual responsibility. They have not been taught to move from reason and
- 529 principle; their wills have been controlled by another, and the mind has not
- 530 been called out that it might expand and strengthen by exercise. They have
- 531 not been directed and disciplined with respect to their peculiar constitutions
- 532 and capabilities of mind to put forth their strongest powers when required. {RH
- 533 July 14, 1885, par. 4}
- 534 Save All the Strength of the Will—The work of "breaking the will" is contrary
- 535 to the principles of Christ. The will of the child must be directed and guided.
- 536 Save all the strength of the will, for the human being needs it all; but give
- 537 it proper direction. Treat it wisely and tenderly, as a sacred treasure. Do
- 538 not hammer it in pieces; but by precept and true example fashion and mold it
- 539 until the child comes to years of responsibility.—Counsels to Parents,
- 540 Teachers, and Students, 116 (1913). {2MCP 688.2}
- 541
- 542 A Final Thought
- 543 The work of the heavenly intelligences, in all their operations, is constantly
- 544 working to induce the human agent to will and to do. ... Will the human agent
- 545 co-operate with the divine? "To will and to do?" [Verse 13.] If man places his
- 546 will on God's side, fully surrendering self to God's will, the high and holy
- 547 endeavor of the human agent takes down the obstruction he himself has
- 548 erected, the rubbish is cleared away from the door of the heart, the
- 549 defiance and barricading of the soul is broken down. The door of the heart is
- 550 opened and Jesus enters, to abide as a welcome guest. {Lt135-1898.14} 2024b
