267 Be a Sunshiny Parent

Parents, the happiness of your children depends upon the way in which 268 you discharge your duty toward them. Teach them carefully and prayer-269 fully, here a little and there a little, leading, guiding, and when necessary 270 commanding. Parents whose hearts are given to the Lord will follow 271 His way in directing their household; and blessings will flow from 272 273 them to their children. {RH January 29, 1901, par. 7} While we are not to indulge blind affection, neither are we to manifest undue 274 severity. Children can not be brought to the Lord by force. They can 275 276 **be led, but not driven.** "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me," Christ declares. He did not say, My sheep hear my 277 voice, and are forced into the path of obedience. In the government of 278 279 children, love must be shown. Never should parents cause their children pain by harshness or unreasonable exactions. Harshness drives 280 souls into Satan's net. {RH January 29, 1901, par. 8} Parents, as surely 281 as you treat your children in a cold, unloving manner, just so surely 282 will the image of God in the soul be defaced. Christians should act like 283 Christ. Cherish and cultivate all that is pure and lovely in the heart 284 285 of your child. Be kind. ... Let there be no fretting, no scolding, no unnecessary exactions. Administer the rules of the home in wisdom and 286 287 love, not with a rod of iron. Children will respond by willing obedience to a rule of love. Commend your children whenever you can. Provide 288 the little ones with innocent amusements. Never wound their 289 hearts by a lack of consideration. Walk constantly in the way of the 290 Lord, following the example set by Christ. {RH January 29, 1901, par. 291 9} Make the home a Bethel, a holy, consecrated place. Make the lives 292 of your children as happy as possible. Keep the soil of the heart mel-293 low by love and affection, thus preparing it for the seed of truth. Re-294 member that the Lord gives the earth not only clouds and rain, but the 295 beautiful, smiling sunshine, causing the seed to spring up and the blos-296 297 soms to appear. Remember that children need not only reproof and correction, but encouragement and commendation, the pleasant sun-298 shine of kind words. {RH January 29, 1901, par. 10} We need more 299 sunshiny parents and more sunshiny Christians. {RH January 29, 300 1901, par. 11} 301
